Presentation Abstract: max. 300 words	Conservation Champions, a collaboration between Petaurus Education Group and the NSW Biodiversity Conservation Trust, is a transformative pedagogical initiative that aims to inspire the next generation to become leaders in biodiversity conservation. The program offers free hands-on and outdoor learning experiences that support a diversity of learners in primary and secondary schools in rural and urban New South Wales. It also provides curriculum-linked resources and activities that encourage inquiry-focussed and student-led lessons. The program encourages interdisciplinary learning by exploring topics such as agriculture, science and citizen science, geography, and literature. The curriculum is underpinned by student voice, enabling students to participate in community-led initiatives and make positive changes in their environment. Conservation Champions is unique in that it connects students with their local community and environment, through collaboration with local First Nations Peoples, Landcare and other government and non-government organisations, fostering a sense of ownership and responsibility towards conservation efforts. By providing opportunities for urban and rural students to experience firsthand the challenges and solutions related to conservation efforts in rural areas, the program helps bridge the gap between these two groups. Through professional development sessions for teachers, the program ensures the sustainability of the initiative beyond its duration. Conservation Champions aligns with Community-Based Social Marketing (CBSM) methodology, promoting behaviour change and using evidence-based practices to evaluate the effectiveness of the program. The initiative not only promotes education and awareness of biodiversity and conservation but also contributes to the preservation of biodiversity in New South Wales. Overall, Conservation Champions is a vital program that provides students with the skills, knowledge, and values needed to become responsible and engaged stewards of the environment.
